Ibuprofen

Uses:

Ibuprofen is used to reduce fever and treat pain or inflammation caused by various conditions such as headache, toothache, menstrual cramps, muscle aches, arthritis, or minor injury. It is a nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drug (NSAID).

Dosage:

Take this medication by mouth, usually every 4 to 6 hours, with a full glass of water. Do not lie down for at least 10 minutes after taking this drug.

Precautions:

Before taking ibuprofen, tell your doctor if you are allergic to it, or if you have any other allergies. This product may contain inactive ingredients, which can cause allergic reactions or other problems. Inform your doctor if you have any medical history, especially of: asthma, liver disease, kidney disease, heart disease, high blood pressure, stomach/intestinal problems (e.g., bleeding, ulcers).

Side Effects:

Common side effects may include upset stomach, nausea, vomiting, headache, diarrhea, constipation, dizziness, or drowsiness. Serious side effects may include severe stomach pain, black or bloody stools, or signs of kidney problems (such as change in the amount of urine).

Warnings:

- Do not take more than the recommended dose.
- Long-term use may increase the risk of heart attack or stroke.
- It may cause stomach or intestinal bleeding, which can be fatal. This condition can occur without warning, especially in older adults.

Interactions:

Ibuprofen can interact with several drugs. Inform your doctor about all the products you use, including prescription/nonprescription drugs and herbal products. Some drugs that may interact with ibuprofen include: blood pressure medications (e.g., ACE inhibitors), blood thinners (e.g., warfarin), and corticosteroids.
